**Single Suite** (1 person/ villa): \$135.00 per person/night

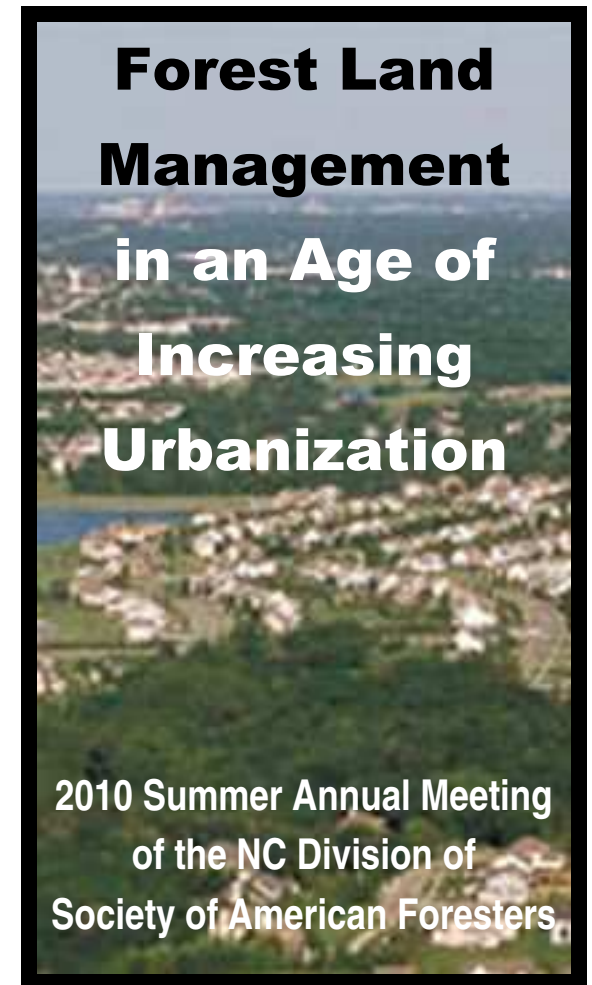
**Single Occupancy** (1 person per bedroom/2 people/villa): \$77.00 per person/ night
